AHCAC is an Aboriginal community-controlled health service located in the Ampilatwatja Community off the Sandover Highway, 350 kms NE of Alice Springs. Traditional culture is strong and the community is governed by the traditional owners.

The Health Centre has small dedicated team including a Clinic Manager/RN, Business Manager, a Senior Medical Officer, local Community Support Workers and administrative support staff.

The Health Centre provides a primary health care service to approximately 650 people who live in the region and also provides clinical care twice weekly to two outstations located approx 40 minutes from the main community of Ampilatwatja.

The CEO position will suit a driven compassionate and result oriented leader with demonstrated Management skills.
