National KPIs: reports and data in OCHREStreams

The Improvement Foundation (IF) held a teleconference on 3/3/2016 on the request of AMSANT to provide feedback on the way data is presented in OCHREStreams and the nKPI report. It was attended by representatives from at least 5 NT ACCHSs staff, NTG Remote, IF, AIHW and the federal DOH. Useful feedback was provided by the ACCHSs and NTG staff to improve the way data is presented in OCHREStreams (totals required for each numerator and denominator), and in the nKPI report so that graphs are easily understood.
