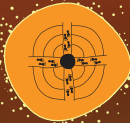

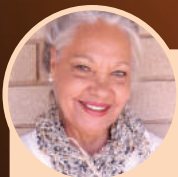
John Paterson was appointed CEO for AMSANT in 2006 and has held many senior management positions within government and Aboriginal community organisations for more than twenty seven years.

Charlie King (MC) is recognised locally for his efforts in leading the No More campaign & won the Social Change Award in 2016 at the NT Human Rights Awards.



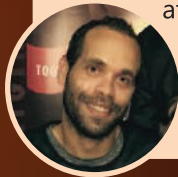
