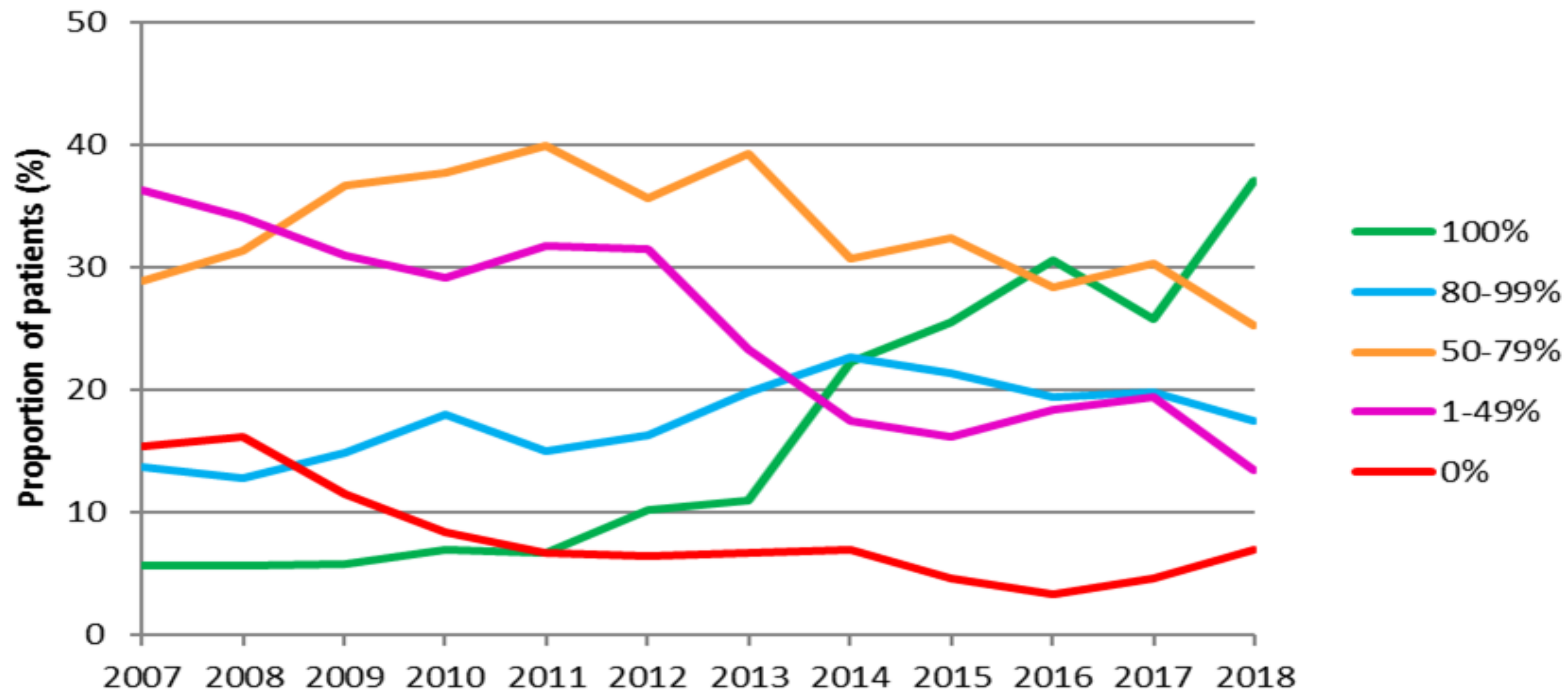

BPG SP adherence rates Northern Territory 2007 - September 2018



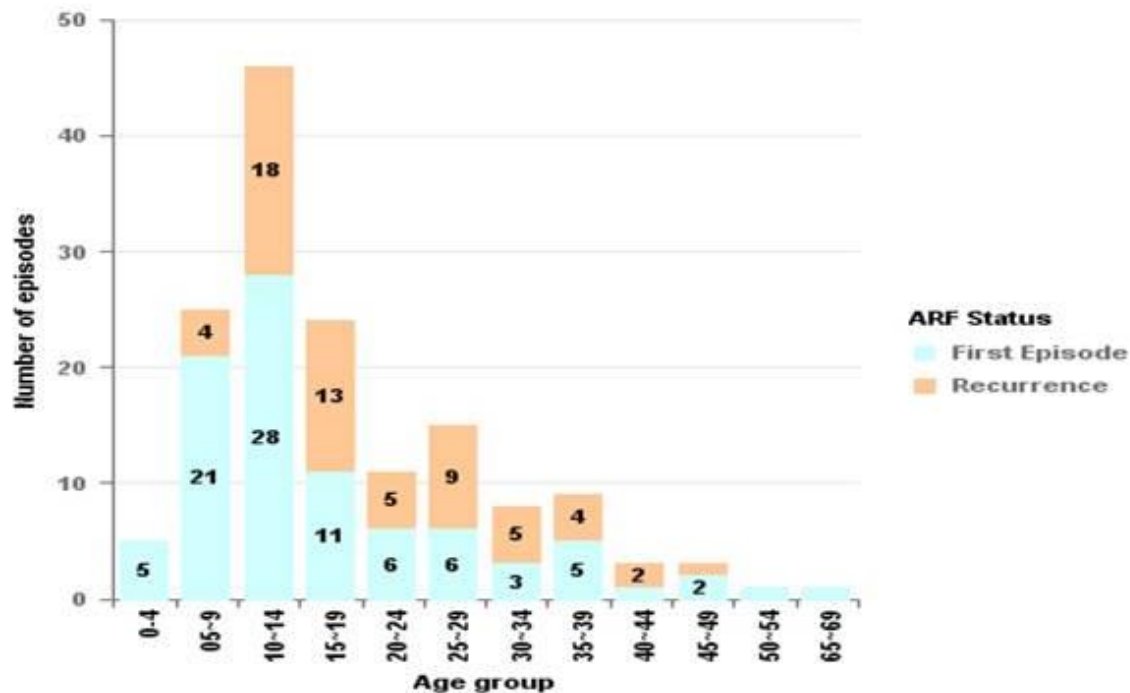

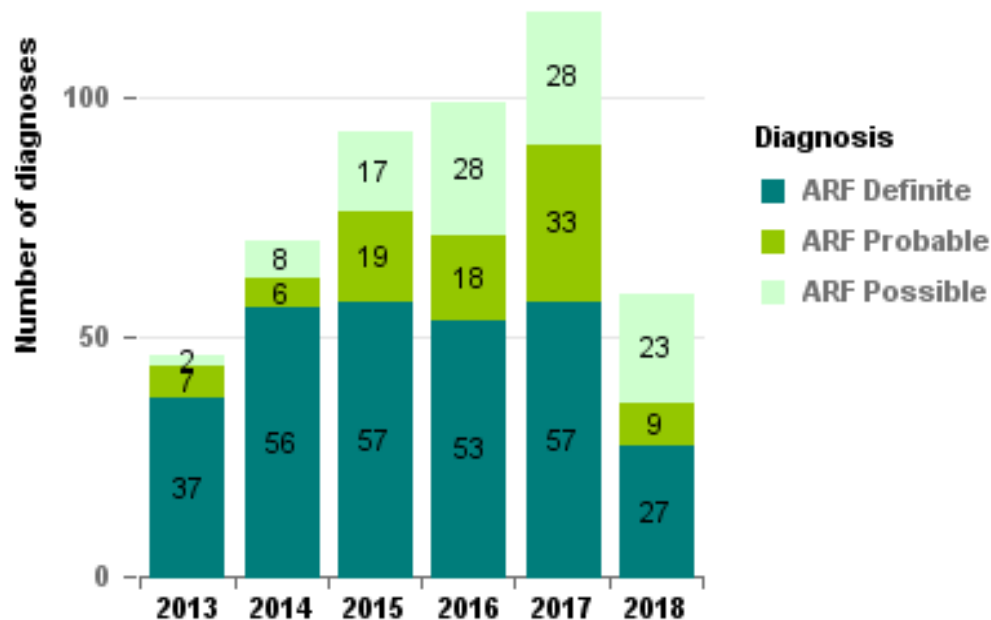

Elements of an RHD Program

- Care plans & recall system
- Regular LABs
- Education
- Cardiology Reviews & ECHO's
- Dental care
- Immunisation
- Environmental circumstances
- Family meetings



Orientation – New Staff

- Use RHD Register staff to orientate new clinic staff – include GPs
- RHD RNs can visit and provide education or by telephone
- Provide an RHD Resource folder – Register & RHDA can assist
- Ensure that staff know the correct service items to use when giving RHD prophylaxis

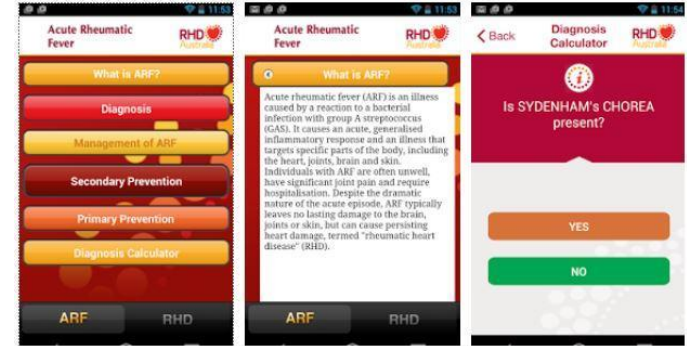

RHD Register

- We are your friends!
- Check that information from the register aligns with PCIS/Communicare
- Prioritise recalls for ECHO's and Cardiology reviews
- Check for latest LAB doses
- Quarterly feedback reports
- Notify when clients move

Education of staff – supervise new learners

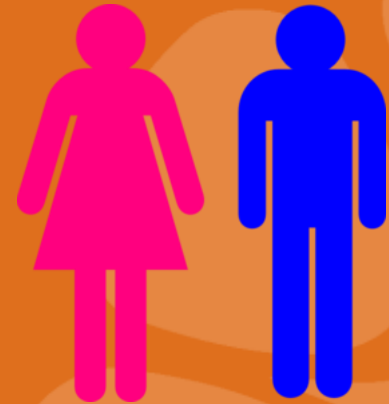
The most appropriate person to give the LAB Build

Fast Tracking and Opportunistic Provision of LAB Injections

- Fast tracking patients when they present for an LAB only
- Opportunistic delivery of LAB – check records!
- Ensure that everyone in the clinic is on the “same page” re: the management of the RHD program

- Take Heart video in language & other videos and resources – RHDA
- Appointment cards
- RHD Treatment Tracker App
- Peer support groups
